




- Brings together key stakeholders of Finnish society. The Commission has been functioning since 1993, chaired by the Prime Minister.
- About 120 members and deputies from different sectors of society.
- The key task is to speed up the implementation of the 2030 Agenda, and link it to the national work on sustainable development.
- Also monitors and assesses the implementation of the 2030 Agenda in Finland.
- Current chair and vice-chairs: Prime Minister Sanna Marin, Minister of the Environment and Climate Change Maria Ohisalo, Minister of Finance Annika Saarikko.



Accountability and debate

Coordination and tools


- Leadership plays a major role in promoting widespread adoption of the sustainability approach and internal culture change in central government




