## **2 - What does DG Regional and Urban Policy offer for cities in order to achieve urban SD?**

# A large share of the ERDF funding goes to cities

- *Obligation to every Member State to devote at least 5% of total investments under ERDF to integrated sustainable urban development*
- *Estimation of nearly half of future funding spent in urban areas in one way or another*
- *50 and 80 percent of their European Regional Development fund (ERDF) investments on ICT, small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and the low-carbon economy.*

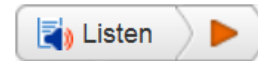

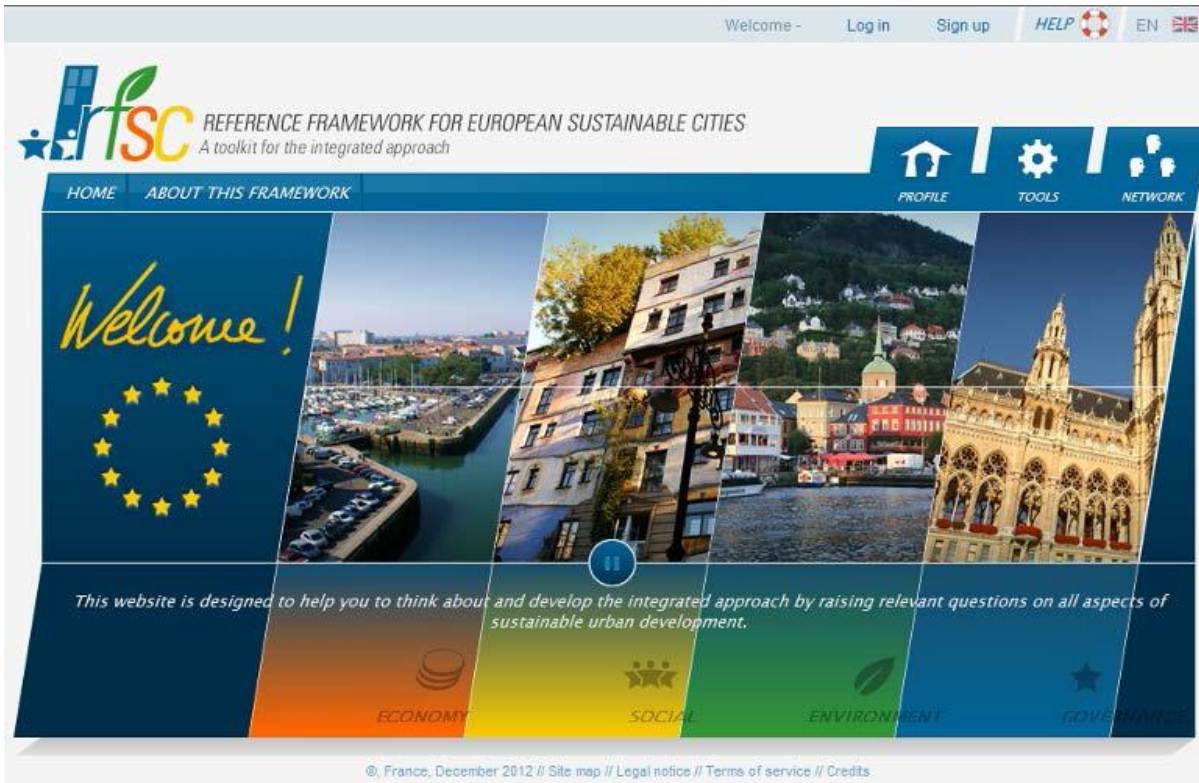

# Reference Framework for European Sustainable Cities

- An interactive web-tool designed for cities created by Member States (led by France) with support of Commission
- To facilitate integrated and sustainable urban development through better dialogue and tools:
  - to develop a sustainable urban strategy or project;
  - to check the integrated approach of an urban strategy or project;
  - to monitor the progress over time.



Available in 18 languages - almost 200 cities now using tool

RFSC will become part of URBACT III from end of 2014 and will be further improved
