

Implementation timeline of Outcome Orientation in Austria



Performance Management (linked to the budget)

- Outcome statements, outputs and indicators per budgeting chapter
- Annual performance management cycle: plan, implement, evaluate, report

Regulatory Impact Assessments

(for policy proposals)

- Ex-Ante Assessment including problem analysis, objectives & indicators, impact on specific policy areas
- Ex-Post Evaluation
- Reporting




Budget and performance structure




Performance management cycle




Budget Chapter Perspective (e.g Line Ministry)





Impact Assessments - Conceptual Framework


- Impact Assessments mandatory for
 - new laws and regulations and
 - major projects (procurement activities, infrastructure projects...)
- No exceptions, but thresholds for in-depth assessments
- Key Features
 - Outcomes (incl. indicators)
 - Outputs (incl. indicators)
 - Intended and unintended impacts in other policy fields
 - Financial information and connection to budget

Process of Impact Assessments in Austria

Lead ministry designs new law, regulation or major project

Lead ministry conducts an impact assessment (key objectives, indicators, implementation measures, expected impacts...)

Support and quality assurance by Federal Performance Management Office and experts for specific impacts from other ministries


RIA additional document for consultation phase and parliamentary discussions

Ex-post evaluation within 5 years

OUTCOME ORIENTATION AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

Suggestions to connect Outcome Orientation and SDGs

- Court of Audit-report on the SDGs(2018)
 - Main Point of criticism: Not a single Outcome-Goal in the federal budget mentions or tries to connect to the SDGs
 - Suggestion: mandatory approach like the goals on equality between men and women
- Voluntary national report of the implementation of the SDGs in Austria (2020)
 - Connecting the Agenda 2030 with questions on finance through budgeterial measures
 - → creating a stronger connection between the instruments of Outcome Orientation and SGDs
 - Connecting to the SDGs should start in the phase of planing the budget and lead to a discussion through the evaluation reports

FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF THE CONNECTION BETWEEN OUTCOME ORIENTATION AND SDGS

A challenging implementation

- Analysis depth
 - The connection between the SDGs themselves is too broad -> connection to the Sub-Goals
- Meaningfulness of the reports
 - Threshold & criterias are needed to declare a certain significants to a desired connection
- Implementation and quality assurance
 - Contact Points inside the ministries on questions if a connection to the SDGs is significant enough
 - Checking the quality of the presented information through an external body
- Relevance
 - Annual reporting for actions and measures may not be enough

Limitations

- Only outcome-oriented information on the federal level will be connected to the Sustainable Development Goals
 - Initiatives from the local level or other public agencies won't be recognized
 - Smaller Initiatives, which don't meet the criteria for the regulatory impact assessment, won't be recognized

Benefits on the system of Outcome Orientation

- More transparency on the goals of politics and performance of the public administration
- Increased focus on result orientation in politics and administration
- Increasing the effectiveness and efficiency of public services
- Basis for a holistic approach (connection of input, output and outcome) and an integration of the management instruments
