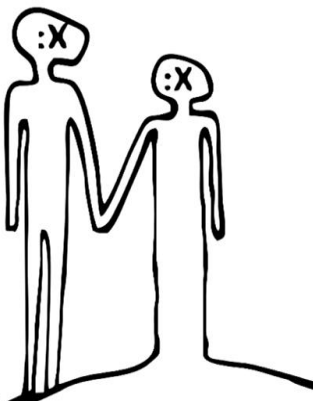

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Sustainable development in Romania

PARCURSUL ROMÂNIEI

April 18

The Parliament of Romania was **the first of the 176 parliaments** of the Inter-parliamentary Union to express its support for the 2030 Agenda, through the joint declaration of the assembled chambers

November 09

The Government of Romania decides to **adopt the Romania's Sustainable Development Strategy 2030**, drawn up under the direct coordination of the Department of Sustainable Development

May 02

The Government of Romania decides to establish the **Consultative Council for Sustainable Development**, which includes 34 experts covering all 17 SDGs

June 08

The Government of Romania decides to adopt the **National Action Plan for the implementation of Romania's Sustainable Development Strategy 2030**, drawn up under the direct coordination of the Department of Sustainable Development

September 25

Romania, next to 192 Heads of State and Government and High Representatives, adopts the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development: **Transforming our world**

May 25

The Government of Romania decides to establish the **Department of Sustainable Development** under the Prime Minister, as the **national coordinator** in implementing the set of 17 Goals of the 2030 Agenda

1st VNR

May 08

The Government of Romania decides to establish the **Interdepartmental Committee for Sustainable Development**, which includes all ministers chaired by Prime Minister

First OECD stocktaking Report: Linking policy planning with SDG budgeting

April 13

The Department of Sustainable Development initiated the **Coalition Sustainable Romania** which brought together representative organizations of civil society and the private sector

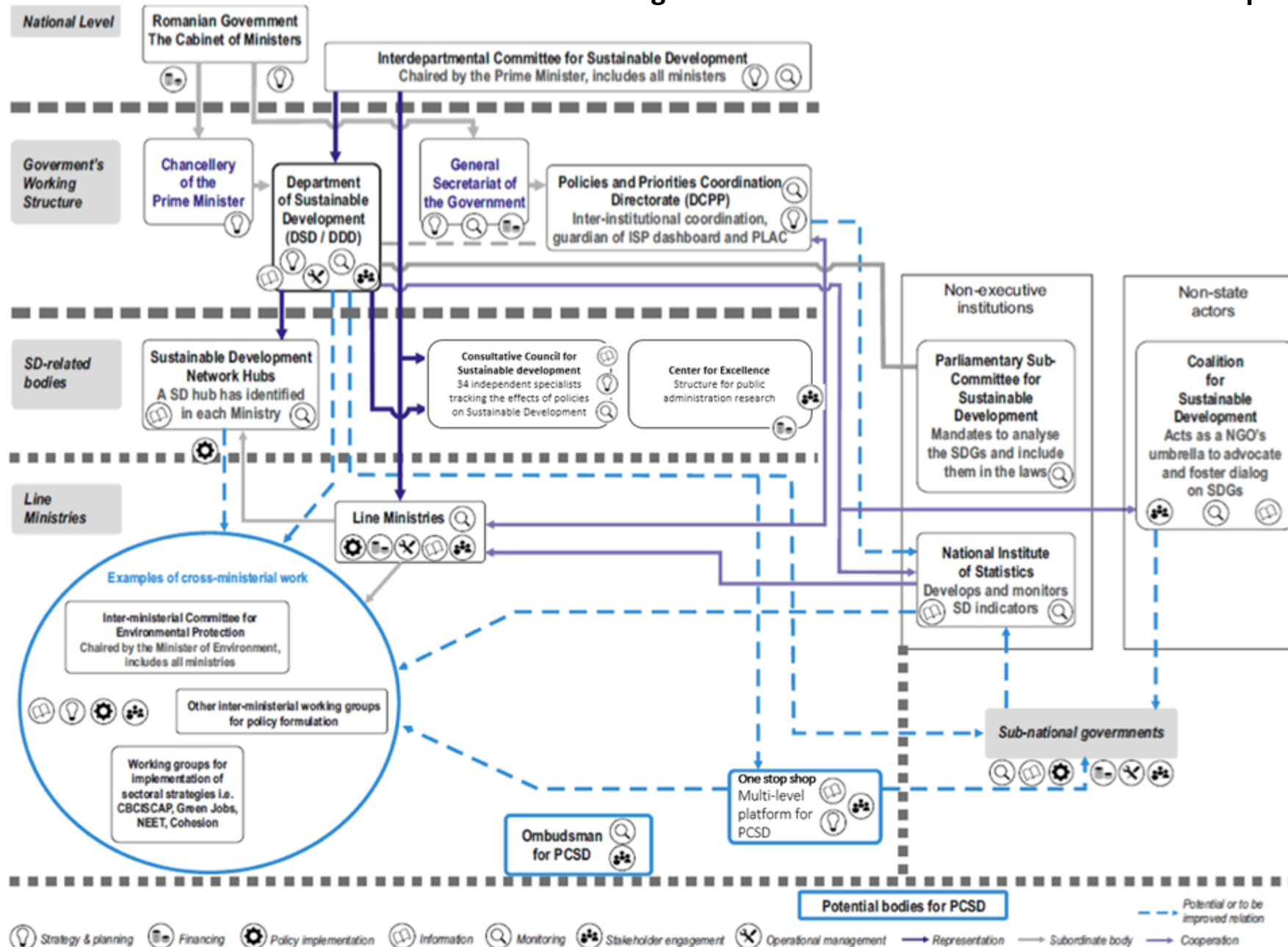

The Department of Sustainable Development sets up the network of **22 hubs for sustainable development** in all ministries, with approx. 90 specialists

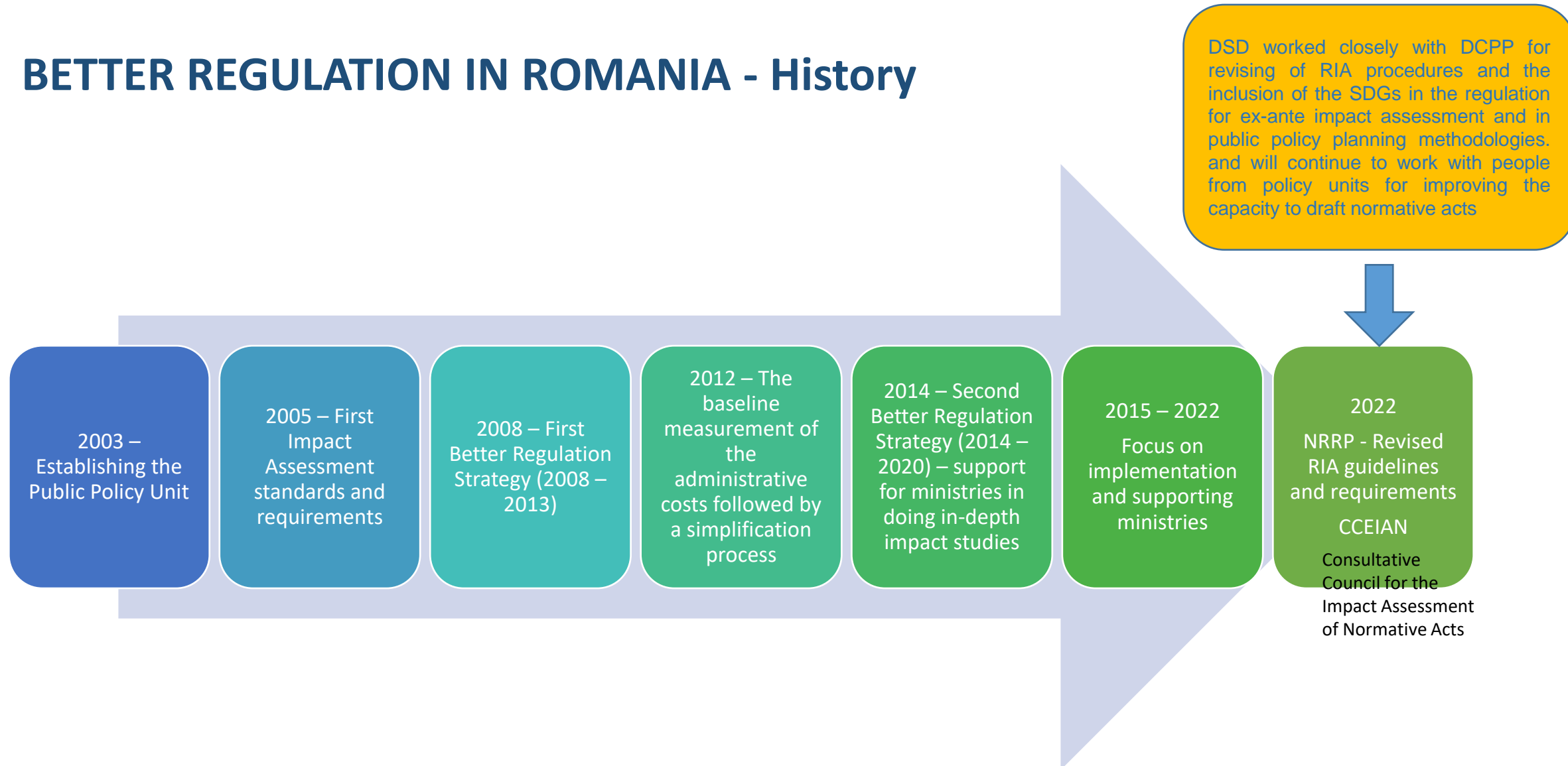
New regulations for embedding the SDGs into national policy planning methodologies

Romania's governance framework for sustainable development and PCSD

BETTER REGULATION IN ROMANIA - History



Legislative changes that enable the integration of the SDGs into policy planning

- adoption of GD 379/2022 which establishes the methodology to improve the system of elaboration, coordination and planning of public policies at the level of the central public administration. The new methodology mandates the DCPD to work together with the DSD towards policy coherence for sustainable development (Art. 5). It also notes that the process to develop government strategies should “present the expected effects of the strategies and related results in a quantifiable manner, describing the economic, social, environmental and cultural changes, including the contribution to sustainable development objectives, as a result of the impact of the strategy implementation” and “present the indicators on the basis of which the evolution of the implementation of the strategy will be measured, with reference to the targeted national indicators of sustainable development” (Art 7)
- GD 427/2022 approves an updated Methodology for the preparation and implementation of budgetary programmes, with a view to ensure an adequate link between priority policies and the budget. This is an opportunity for the implementation of NAP Specific Objective 2 - National budget planning framework for the implementation of budgeting based on sustainable development objectives.
- GD 443/2022 updates the ex ante evaluation methodology for draft regulations. The DSD has proposed that each ex-ante evaluation must identify the relevant SDGs for that initiative and report on this in a section dedicated to sustainable development. The assessment questions would correspond or be similar to those applied in the EU Better Regulation toolbox.

Ongoing projects in support of enhancing PCSD and capacity building

- The project “Enhancing policy coherence, transparency and coordination at the Centre of Government in Romania”, funded by the European Commission through the Technical Support Instrument (TSI), aims at **building capacity of the GSG to consolidate its role in policy development and coordination, in line with the ambitions outlined by Romania in the public administration reform that is part of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan (NRRP)**, and the strengthening of the role of the policy units in line ministries.
- The project “Capacity building in the field of public governance – a coordinated approach of the Centre of the Government of Romania”, funded by EEA-Norway grants, includes a component that focuses specifically on the implementation of the SDGs. The main outputs of the project:
 - stocktaking report on the progress in enhancing PCSD in Romania: Opportunities and challenges in NAP implementation
 - an implementation roadmap for the NAP.
 - workshop 29 November 2022, Mechanisms and tools for addressing NAP bottlenecks: Towards internal guidance for implementing the NAP’s 12 Specific Objectives in accordance with the NSDS targets; **Case study: Italy’s PCSD National Action Plan**
 - workshop 28 February 2023, Capacity building in the field of public governance: A coordinated approach of the Centre of the Government of Romania; A peer learning workshop with the Czech Republic

Purpose of the workshop

- On short term, to initiate discussions on how to ensure a better coordination between the main institutions involved in the RIA process.
- In the medium-term:
 - To establish an informal/formal procedure within ministries on how to involve the experts on sustainable development in the RIA process preceding the drafting of a policy document or a normative act. What type of input and support should the experts provide? How close are they to the decision-making process/structures in their institution?
 - to ensure better coordination between the DSD and DCP, especially regarding the scrutiny of the new legislative proposals. For example, should DSD provide inputs to the new Consultative Council for Impact Assessment of Normative Acts?

In parallel, efforts should be made to build capacity, including by:

- Training ministries on how to identify and describe the correlation between the new legislative proposals and the SDGs according to OECD and EU guidelines and standards.
- Organizing workshops and training sessions with concrete examples both from international and local practices.
- Developing specific instructions on how to fill in the section on sustainable development from Annex 1 to GD 443/2022 – the main regulation on RIA.
