The Framework for the implementation of the SDG in BiH

- A key document that guides the implementation of the 2030 Agenda in BiH.
- Developed in the period 2019-2020 with the involvement of a wide range of stakeholders, including institutions at all levels of government, the private sector, and civil society organizations.
- [The Framework for the implementation of the SDG in BiH](#) has been accepted by the Government of the Brčko District of BiH, the governments of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina (FBiH) and Republika Srpska (RS), as well as the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina (December 2020 - April 2021)

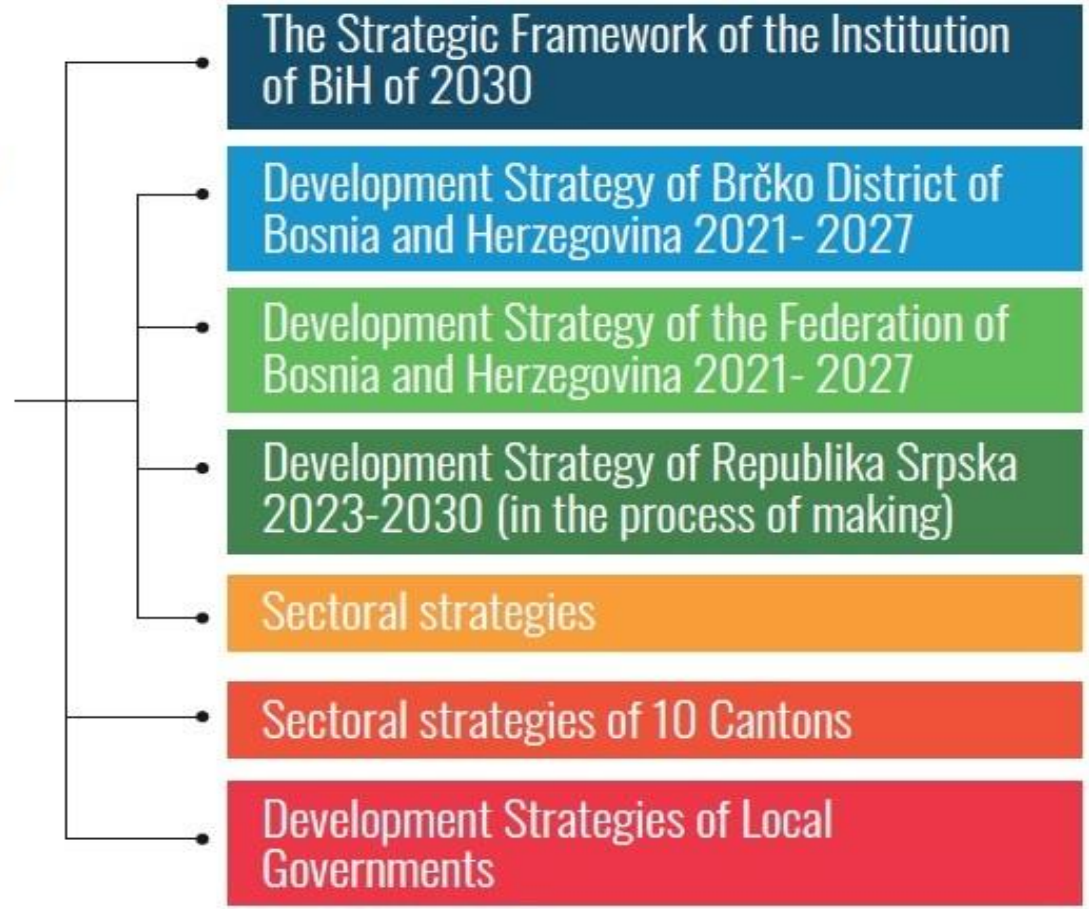
- Equal access to education

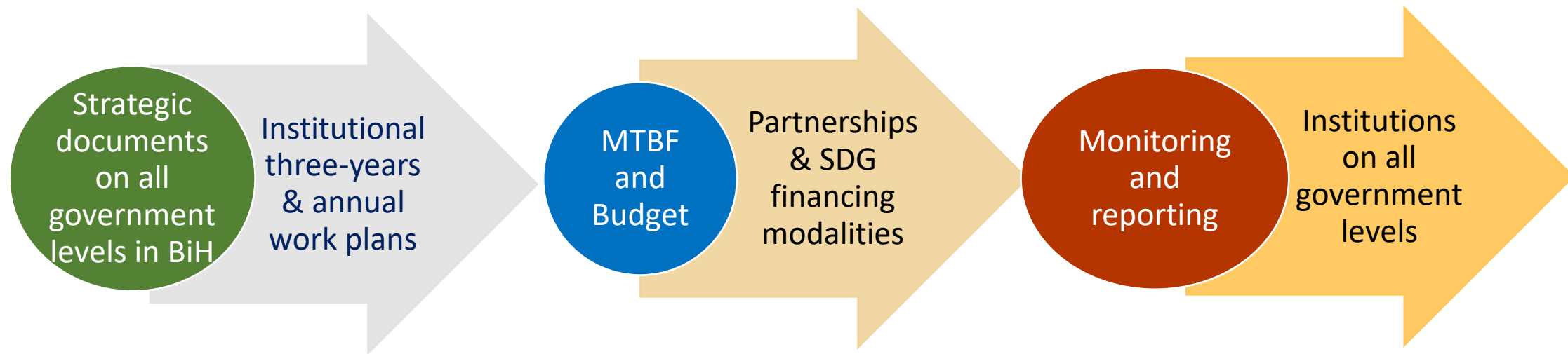
Implementation pathways of SDGs in BiH

Through Systems for Strategic planning and Development Management at all government levels in BiH





BiH SDG Council – purpose & functions

Management, monitoring, reporting, and coordination of processes related to the progress in the implementation of the SDG Framework in BiH;

- ✓ Monitoring the implementation of the Framework by incorporating its elements into the strategic and implementation documents at each level of government in BiH;
- ✓ Coordination, monitoring, and reporting (including the preparation of the next VNR for 2023 and 2030);
- ✓ Advocating for strengthening existing and establishing innovative financial mechanisms and/or instruments for the more effective implementation of the Framework;
- ✓ Initiating the development and preparation of analyses and research in collaboration with relevant statistical, scientific research, and other institutions for the purpose of monitoring the SDGs implementation;
- ✓ Participation in the development, monitoring, and implementation of international documents in the field of sustainable development;
- ✓ Providing support for the involvement of socio-economic partners, such as civil society organizations, private sector, local governments, the academic community, as well as parliaments, in the process of implementing and monitoring the Framework;
- ✓ Promoting and raising public awareness about the importance of achieving the SDGs

SDG Financing Framework

LESSONS LEARNED

- The development of the DFA/Road Map and the SDG financing framework required strong involvement of government leadership representatives – frequently a challenge.
- Innovative SDG financial instruments are novelty for BiH. This required applying the learning by doing approach, which often slow down the work but was key for ensuring critical level of understanding of the WG for further dialogue/work.
 - The SDG FF implementation in regard to recommended set of policies and financial instruments for SDG acceleration will require further targeted capacity building across the governments in BiH
- The recommended SDG FF solutions (for the SDG financial instruments) had to be elaborated at the technical concepts level (as for the real-life programming are necessary technical studies and government decision)
 - It will be necessary to provide targeted technical assistance (including capacity building) for participatory development of the feasibility studies for the selected first wave of SDG financial instruments
 - It will be necessary to support governments in building (technical / financial) partnerships with relevant DFI/IFs and donors that can contribute to SDG Financing Framework implementation.

- SDG Financing Framework
 - In the process of adoption
 - Adoption to be followed by wide promotion, including an SDG financing conference
 - Technical assistance for SDG financing instruments (feasibility studies)
- Optimization and strategic re-channeling of public funds towards the SDGs in selected areas
 - Continuous work with line ministries on optimization and strategic re-channeling of public funds towards the SDGs in selected areas (ECD, health, labour...).
 - Practical advocacy for specific SDG business case - investment vs. cost (e.g. Early childhood development – UNDP/UNICEF).

Localization

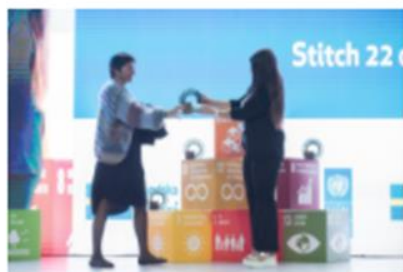
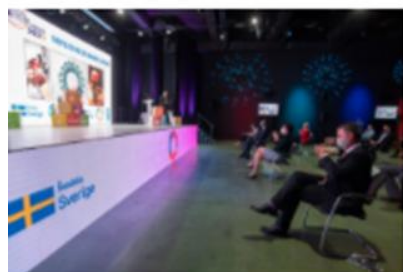
- Encourage local communities to participate more actively and robustly in achieving the Agenda 2030.
- More than 40 cities and municipalities included so far - process is continuing.
- Challenge: inability of local authorities and businesses to recognize the real benefits of transforming towards sustainable management of their communities and business operations.



Engagement of the private sector

NAGRADA ZA BIZNIS LIDERE
ODRŽIVOG RAZVOJA
2021

- Launched in 2019 as an annual award promoting private sector companies (creating decent jobs and piloting the decarbonization process) based on Swedish and Czech experiences.
- Increased interest from the private sector and a continuous increase in the number of applicants (109 businesses applied in 2021, 160 in 2022 and 180 applications in 2023).
- Introduced annual award for local self-governments.

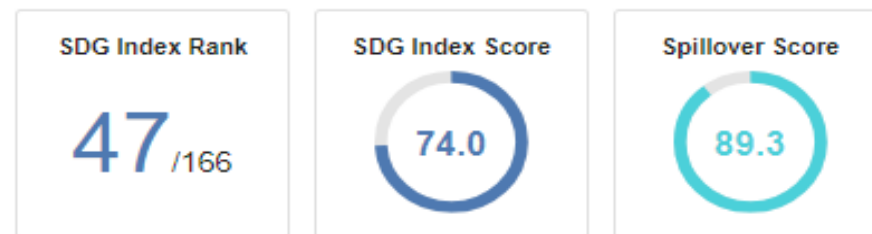
